## SAFETY INFORMATION AND SPECIFICATIONS



CAUTION: The top surface of this stand is designed for use with a product weighing no more than $135 \mathrm{lbs} .(61.2 \mathrm{~kg}$ ) and having a width that permits it to sit evenly on the stand with no more than a one-inch overhang on each side of the shelf. Use with products that weigh more than the maximum weight allowed, or with dimensions that extend beyond the maximum width may result in instability, which may result in injury.

## ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

## Step 1: Attach the back stretchers between the side frames

Tip: Assemble your stand on a carpeted floor or the empty TV stand carton to avoid scratching it.
1 Insert four $15 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ bolts (U), with lock washers (W) and flat washers (X), through the drilled holes on the left side frame $(\mathbf{A})$ and screw them into the threaded holes on the side of the back stretchers ( $\mathbf{G}$ ) with the 4 mm hex key (EE). Make sure that the metal brackets on the back stretchers (G) are located on the front side and faced inward.
2 Repeat the same procedure to attach the right side frame (B).
NOTE: Do not fully tighten all bolts until you finish assembling all of the parts. After assembly, go back and fully tighten all bolts. This will make the assembly easier.

## Step 2: Attach the back panel between the back stretchers

- Using the pilot holes as guide, insert four 10 mm screws (R) through the metal brackets of the back stretchers (G) and securely screw them into the back panel (L) using a Phillips screwdriver.

## Step 3: Align and attach the top shelf to the side frames

- Insert four $15 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ bolts (U), with lock washers (W) and flat washers (X), through the drilled holes on the top rails of both side frames ( $\mathbf{A}$ and $\mathbf{B}$ ), then securely screw them into the threaded holes on the top shelf (I) using the 4 mm hex key (EE).

## Step 4: Align and attach the middle shelf to the side frames

- Insert four $15 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ bolts ( $\mathbf{U}$ ), with lock washers ( $\mathbf{W}$ ) and flat washers ( $\mathbf{X}$ ), through the drilled holes on the middle rails of both side frames ( $\mathbf{A}$ and $\mathbf{B}$ ), then securely screw them into the threaded holes on the middle shelf (J) using the 4 mm hex key (EE).

## Step 5: Attach the bottom subframe

- Insert four 5/8" bolts (T), with lock washers (W) and flat washers (X), through the end brackets on the left and right rails ( $\mathbf{E}$ and $\mathbf{F}$ ), then securely screw them into the threaded holes on the bottom crossbar ( $\mathbf{D}$ ) with the 4 mm hex key (EE). Make sure that the metal tabs face inward and are flush with each other.

## Step 6: Attach the bottom subframe to the bottom shelf

1 Insert six $5 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ bolts ( $\mathbf{T}$ ), with lock washers ( $\mathbf{W}$ ) and flat washers ( $\mathbf{X}$ ), through the metal tabs on the bottom crossbar ( $\mathbf{D}$ ) and the side rails ( $\mathbf{E}$ and $\mathbf{F}$ ), then finger tighten them into the threaded holes on the bottom shelf (K).

2 Tighten the bolts (T) with the 4 mm hex key (EE).

## Step 7: Align and attach the bottom shelf to the side frames

- Insert four 2 1/4" bolts (V), with lock washers (W) and flat washers (X), through the drilled holes on the bottom rails of both side frames ( $\mathbf{A}$ and $\mathbf{B}$ ), then securely screw them into the threaded holes on the bottom shelf $(\mathbf{K})$ with the 4 mm hex key (EE).



## Step 8: Attach the support legs to the bottom shelf

1 Securely screw two support legs (H) into the threaded holes on the back rail of the bottom shelf (K).
2 Stand the assembled frame upright.
NOTE: For swivel stand assembly, see "SWIVEL STAND ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS" on page $2 \underline{26}$. For Wall Mount or Table Top assembly, continue to the next step.


## Step 9: Attach the cable clips

- Attach two of the cable clips (Q) to the back of the side frames (A and $\mathbf{B}$ ) with two $5 / 8$ " bolts ( $\mathbf{T}$ ) per cable clip using the 4 mm hex key (EE).

## Step 10: Position the TV stand and install the tipping restraint hardware kit

1 Position the assembled stand against a wall where you plan to use it.
2 Adjust the leveling feet to level the TV stand.
3 Follow the instructions printed on the bag containing the tipping restraint hardware kit (GG) to attach the restraint hardware to the wall and the stand.
WARNING: It is very important that the tipping restraint be installed correctly. Failure to do this could result in your TV/stand assembly falling forward, resulting in damage to equipment or personal injury.

## WALL MOUNT ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

## Step 1: Select the correct bolts, washers, and spacers for your TV.

If you are in doubt about which size bolt to use, try one of the bolts in one of the four Vesa mounting holes on the back of your TV. A bolt that is too large will be obvious and not fit in the hole at all, but make sure that the bolt size you choose is not too loose. It should grip the hole threads evenly and not wobble. After you determine which size bolts to use, go on to the next step.

## M4 hardware assembly:

-M4 x 12 mm bolts (HH) top screw holes -M4 x 30 mm bolts (II) bottom screw holes -M4 lock washers (SS) -M4/M5 Flat washers (YY) -Small spacers (XX)

## M5 hardware assembly:

-M5 x 12 mm bolts (J) top screw holes
-M5 x 30 mm bolts (KK) bottom screw holes -M5 lock washers (TT) -M4/M5 flat washers (YY) -Small spacers (XX)

## M6 hardware assembly:

-M6 x 12 mm bolts (LL) top screw holes
-M6 x 35 mm bolts (MM) bottom screw holes
-M6 lock washers (UU)
-M6/M8 flat washers (ZZ)
-Large spacers (WW)

## M8 hardware assembly:

-M8 x 16 mm bolts (NN) or M8 x 20 mm bolts (PP) top screw holes $\cdot \mathrm{M} 8 \times 40$ bolts (QQ) or M8 x 50 bolts (RR) bottom screw holes -M8 lock washers (VV) -M6/M8 flat washers (ZZ)
-Large spacers (WW)

## Step 2: Determine whether your TV has a flat back or an irregular or obstructed back or a curved screen

1 Carefully place your TV screen face-down on a cushioned, clean surface to protect the screen from damages and scratches.
2 If your TV has a table-top stand attached, remove the stand. See the documentation that came with your TV for instructions.
3 Temporarily lay the TV brackets ( $\mathbf{P}$ ) vertically on the back of your TV.
4 Align the screw holes in the TV brackets with the mounting screw holes on your TV.
5 Identify which type of back your TV may have:

- Flat back: The brackets lay flush against the back of your TV and do not block any jacks. You do not need spacers when assembling the wall mount.

- Obstructed back: The brackets block any of the jacks on the back of your TV. You will need spacers when assembling the wall mount.

- Irregularly-shaped back or curved screen TVs: There is a gap between the bracket and some part of the back of your TV. You will need spacers when assembling the wall mount.


6 Remove the brackets.

## Step 3: Option 1 - Mounting bracket instructions for a TV with a flat back

## To mount the TV brackets:

1 Insert the selected bolts through the washers and proper mounting holes on the TV brackets (P) (for the 100 x 100 mm vesa pattern you'll need to lift the bracket hangers to insert the screws), then finger tighten them into the threaded holes on the back of your TV. Make sure the TV brackets are centered and level with each other and the hooks face the bottom of the TV.
NOTE: Lean the TV up against a wall or other solid surface when attaching with the TV brackets. DO NOT place the TV face down on the glass, this may cause permanent damage.

2 Tighten the bolts until they are snug against the TV bracket using a Phillips screwdriver. DO NOT over tighten.

## Step 3: Option 2 - Mounting bracket instructions for a TV with an irregularly shaped or obstructed back or curved screen TVs.

1 Insert the selected bolts through the washers and proper mounting holes on the TV brackets (P) (for the 100 x 100 mm vesa pattern you'll need to lift the bracket hangers to insert the screws), then finger tighten them into the threaded holes on the back of your TV. Make sure the TV brackets are centered and level with each other and the hooks face the bottom of the TV.
NOTE: Lean the TV up against a wall or other solid surface when attaching with the TV brackets. DO NOT place the TV face down on the glass, this may cause permanent damage.
2 Tighten the bolts until they are snug against the TV bracket using a Phillips screwdriver. DO NOT over tighten.

## Step 4: Option 1 - Mount the frame to a stud wall

NOTE: See Step 4: Option 2 for instructions on mounting the frame to a concrete wall.
1 Use a stud sensor to locate two adjacent wall studs, then position the mounting frame ( $\mathbf{N}$ ) exactly between the two studs.
2 Use a level to make sure that the mounting frame is level, then mark the four mounting holes. Remove the mounting frame.
3 Drill four 3/16" ( 4.76 mm ) holes 2.5" ( 64 mm ) deep.
4 Align the mounting frame ( $\mathbf{N}$ ) with the pilot holes, then secure it to the wall with four lag bolts (AA) and four washers (BB).
CAUTION: Make sure that the lag bolts are tight and secure, but do not overtighten them.

## Step 4: Option 2 - Mount the frame to a block or concrete wall

1 Place the mounting frame ( $\mathbf{N}$ ) against the wall where you intend to mount the TV. Use a level to make sure the mounting frame ( $\mathbf{N}$ ) is level, then mark the four mounting holes on the wall. Never locate the mounting holes into the mortar between blocks. Remove the mounting frame.
2 Drill four 7/16" (11 mm) holes through the screw marks to a depth of 2.5" ( 64 mm ).
3 Insert a concrete anchor (CC) into each of the screw holes using a hammer.
4 Align the mounting frame over the concrete anchors.
5 Place a washer (BB) over one of the mounting frame screw holes, then insert a lag bolt (AA) and tighten.
6 Repeat the previous step for the other three screw holes.
CAUTION: Make sure that the lag bolts are tight and secure, but do not overtighten them.

## Step 5: Attaching the TV to the mounting frame on the wall

1 Lift the TV up to the mounting frame (N).
2 Set the hooks on TV brackets ( $\mathbf{P}$ ) over the mounting frame, then lower the hooks onto the bars on the mounting frame.
3 Center the TV, then secure it in place using a screwdriver to tighten the safety bolt on the bottom hooks.
4 Place the stand with the glass shelves under the TV.


Note: In this step the mounting frame has already been mounted to the wall. This illustration shows the TV from the back view

## Step 6: Adjusting the tilt

The TV brackets ( $\mathbf{P}$ ) allow you to make a tilt adjustment of up to $11^{\circ}$ down and $5^{\circ}$ up to provide optimum viewing and minimize glare.
1 Loosen the tension knobs on both TV brackets (P), then grasp the edge of the TV and move it up or down to the position you want.
2 Turn the tension knob clockwise to secure the brackets in position. Use the the 4.76 mm hex wrench (Z) to tighten the tension knobs, if necessary.

## Step 7: Position the TV stand and install the tipping restraint hardware kit

1 Position the assembled stand against a wall where you plan to use it.
2 If necessary, adjust the leveling feet to level the TV stand.
3 Follow the instructions printed on the bag containing the tipping restraint hardware kit (GG) to attach the restraint hardware to the wall and the stand.

## SWIVEL STAND ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

## Step 1: Align and attach the long rear support

- Insert four $21 / 4$ " bolts (V), with lock washers (W) and the flat washers (X), through the drilled holes in the long rear support ( $\mathbf{C}$ ), then securely screw them into the threaded holes of the side frames ( $\mathbf{A}$ and $\mathbf{B}$ ) with the 4 mm hex key (EE).

NOTE: Make sure that the sockets for the cable clips face backward.

## Step 2: Attach the swivel bracket

1 Align the swivel bracket (M) at the height you would like the center of your TV to be.
2 Insert a $214^{\prime \prime}$ bolt (V), with a lock washer (W) and a flat washer (X), through the swiveling bracket ( $\mathbf{N}$ ) and the long rear support (C).
3 Place a second flat washer $(\mathbf{X})$ and a lock washer (W) onto the end of the threaded bolt, then finger tighten a hex nut ( $\mathbf{Y}$ ) onto the bolt.
4 Repeat this procedure for the three remaining holes.
5 Securely tighten with the open end wrench (DD) and 4 mm hex key (EE).
NOTE: The swivel bracket allows your TV to swivel from side to side, but will not allow your TV to tilt up or down.

## Step 3: Attach the mounting frame to the swivel bracket

1 Hold the flat side of the mounting frame (N) against the swivel bracket (M), aligning the holes. Make sure that the two recessed holes on mounting frame ( $\mathbf{N}$ ) are at the bottom.
2 Insert a 1/2" bolt (S), with a lock washer (W) and a flat washer (X), through the hole in the swivel bracket (M), then screw it into the threaded hole on the mounting frame ( $\mathbf{N}$ ).
3 Repeat this for the three remaining holes joining the swiveling bracket (M) to the mounting frame (N).
4 Securely tighten with the 4 mm hex key (EE).

## Step 4: Attach the cable clips

- Attach the cable clips (Q) to the back of the long rear support (C) in two of four possible locations with two 5/8" bolts ( $\mathbf{T}$ ) per cable clip.

## Step 5: Attaching the TV to the mounting frame on the swivel bracket

1 Attach the TV brackets ( $\mathbf{P}$ ) to the back of the television following the steps on pages $\underline{18}, \mathbf{1 9}$, and $\underline{20}$, depending on the type of TV that you own.
2 Lift the TV up to the mounting frame (N).
3 Set the hooks on TV brackets ( $\mathbf{P}$ ) over the mounting frame ( $\mathbf{N}$ ), then lower the hooks onto the bars of the mounting frame.
4 Center the TV, then secure it in place using a screwdriver to tighten the safety bolt on the bottom hooks. Tighten until the safety bolt hits the underside of the mounting frame.

## Step 6: Adjusting the tilt

The TV brackets $(\mathbf{P})$ allow you to make a tilt adjustment of up to $11^{\circ}$ down and $5^{\circ}$ up to provide optimum viewing and minimize glare.
1 Loosen the tension knobs on both TV brackets (P), then grasp the edge of the TV and move it up or down to the position you want.
2 Turn the tension knob clockwise to secure the brackets in position. Use the the 4.76 mm hex wrench $(\mathbf{Z})$ to tighten the tension knobs, if necessary.

## CARE AND MAINTENANCE

## Wood/Laminate

- Use your favorite type of furniture polish.
- Do not spray polish directly onto the stand. Spray onto a soft cloth then wipe the stand.
- Always test any polish in a discrete location first, such as the back of the stand, to make sure that there is no adverse reaction.
- Dust frequently with a soft cloth.
- Never slide objects across surfaces. Lift objects from the top surface rather than dragging them across the finish when moving them.
- Do not expose your stand to direct sunlight, drying heat sources, or dampness.


## Glass

- Use a commercial liquid glass cleaner and a soft cloth.
- Do not use harsh powders or any other abrasive substances as they will scratch the glass.
- Clean spills immediately with a soft, damp cloth.
- Protect surfaces by using felt, leather, or cork under accessories.
- Use a protective pad when using your stand as a writing surface (especially when using a ballpoint pen).
- Dust frequently with a soft cloth.

For this warranty to apply, your Product must be purchased in the United States or Canada from a Best Buy branded retail store or online at www.bestbuy.com or www.bestbuy.ca, and is packaged with this warranty statement.

## How long does the coverage last?

The Warranty Period lasts for 1 year ( 365 days) from the date you purchased the Product. Your purchase date is printed on the receipt you received with the Product.

## What does this warranty cover?

During the Warranty Period, if the original manufacture of the material or workmanship of the Product is determined to be defective by an authorized Insignia repair center or store personnel, Insignia will (at its sole option): (1) repair the Product with new or rebuilt parts; or (2) replace the Product at no charge with new or rebuilt comparable products or parts. Products and parts replaced under this warranty become the property of Insignia and are not returned to you. If service of Products or parts are required after the Warranty Period expires, you must pay all labor and parts charges. This warranty lasts as long as you own your Insignia Product during the Warranty Period. Warranty coverage terminates if you sell or otherwise transfer the Product.

## How to obtain warranty service?

If you purchased the Product at a Best Buy retail store location, please take your original receipt and the Product to any Best Buy store.
